Otto was a member of the VFW and the San Diego Swiss Club. Otto's family would like to thank Mr. Joe Ringe for graciously hosting Otto's memorial.

#### Bob Egger remembers Otto Rollin

Otto and I were in our teens when we met and did just about everything together. I will share a few memories and some trips we took.

We were in our early teens and took a trip to The High Sierras with a group of twenty. Some even rode horses. It was so cold we had ice on our sleeping bags when we woke up. We had fun walking in the mountains.

In our mid teens, and before the Swiss Club had a hall the members would meet in Chula Vista at the American Legion Post 343 for dances. We didn't know how to dance until Frank Metaur (the bartender) gave us a lot of beer and soon we were out dancing with Tootsie Stockhalper, Evelyn Blatler, and Mancie Klemm.

I remember once when Otto and I drove Frank Metaur's 1936 Ford nearby at a school. We were fishtailing and wrecked the grass up pretty bad.

In our early 20's, Otto, Paul R., myself, Leo Potvin and his father-inlaw took a trip to Utah to deer hunt. We killed a deer, hauled it in the jeep and Otto cooked it for us. He cooked the heart with some wine. We slept in the camper. Otto and I slept on the top bed. It was very cold and the farts were very smelly. We met some hunters while there but one hunter almost shot Otto because of his faded jacket. Otto was color blind so apparently didn't pick the right color jacket for the woods. He was very embarrassed, his face turned red and was pissed off.

Otto, Paul and myself took another trip when we were in our 20's to Montana. We met up with the Brogen brothers from Chula Vista. We slept all in one tent and boy was it freezing cold. We were snuggled in our sleeping bags from head to toe. Every night we heard cans rattling, must have been raccoons. One night Paul R. was having a nightmare that a bear came into the tent. He started fighting with himself and tried to rip his clothes off. Otto was laughing the whole time. That morning, a hunter told us that he had shot an ELK but it got away. Otto followed the blood trail and found it and shot it.

Otto was a good small bore top shooter (heavy 22 caliber). At a shooting competition in Los Angeles with 25 shooters, the San Diego team took two out of the five trophies given. At a competition in San Diego, (the prize being parts of a hog), Otto gave Clem Muller, Sr. drinks to make sure he got the biggest hind quarter because Clem was the butcher. The butchering took place at the Hofer's milk house washroom. If you came in last place you got the Hog Head.

One weekend, maybe after a Schwingfest, around midnight, Otto and I got stopped for racing our cars in El Centro. The cop asked Otto if he knew that guy, Otto replied, "no, never seen that guy before." We both got tickets anyway.

Otto joined the Air Force in his late 20's or early 30's and was stationed in England. When he came home he shared a lot of Limey jokes. He heard a lot of jokes at Arnold's garage too, he was a real jokester.

Otto worked at South Bay Chevrolet in Chula Vista. He specialized in repairing Corvairs. The motor was under the shield. Only two mechanics could repair the motors, the rest of the mechanics refused to work on them. Otto said every Corvair on the road would come to him.

At the Swiss Club Otto was a great chef, especially with Bratwurst and Onions. He also made some really good Pear Schnapps.

He was always at the Swiss Club, never missed a Schwingfest. He will truly be missed.
