





Steinstossen Stone Throw

Steinstossen (stone throwing) is a centuries-old Swiss Alpine traditional sport. Competitors hurl a huge stone in three rounds into a designated area and the winner, being the one throwing his or her stone the longest distance.

Stones used at festivals in Switzerland are of varying sizes and weights, but usually are not much over 100 pounds. The largest stone used is the famed Unspunnen stone weighing 184 pounds which is only used every three years at the Eidgenössisches and every six years at the Unspunnen Festivals.

A Brief History of Egger Dairy and Biography of Robert Egger Sr.

In the late 1800s and early 1900s, many Swiss farmers migrated to the US hoping to better their fortunes. Robert Egger Sr. was one of these hopeful young farmers. A cheesemaker and cow-herder from Kerns, an idyllic village in the mountains of Switzerland, Egger hoped to have his own farm in the United States. He came to the US through Ellis Island in 1926, then promptly settled in California where he worked several jobs in pursuit of his dream.

Robert Egger eventually found a job working for August M. Schnell. Schnell started selling milk to the Hotel Del Coronado in 1888 and owned two dairy farms, one on Dairy Mart Rd. in San Ysidro and the other on the corner of Leon Ave. and 19th St. (which was later renamed to Saturn Blvd.). The great depression began affecting milk prices and Schnell was having difficulty affording upkeep on his second farm on Leon Ave. Egger saw potential in the dairy industry; he used his savings to start buying the old dairy in 1931, eventually turning it into Egger Dairy.

Robert Egger Sr. met Emma Studer, a young Swiss immigrant from Ober-Frick at a church in Point Loma and they were married on July 8, 1932. They had three children: Robert Jr, Walter, and Mary.

Robert Egger Sr. hired as many workers as he could afford, but life was difficult for the young Egger family. Robert Sr. worked 16-18 hours a day and Emma served as cook for the family and all the workers. Even the kids helped on the farm. On top of the difficulties of the great depression, the new dairy farm had a streak of bad luck. The Tijuana River Valley flooded frequently and during a particularly terrible storm in 1938, the winds blew down two silos. Robert was persistent and scraped together the funds to build a new 120ft hay barn by the end of 1938.

In 1939, Egger Dairy's luck started to turn around. Dairy Mart, the milk cooperative that Egger Dairy was a part of, was awarded a military contract at the beginning of WWII to provide milk for the US Navy. Soon, the milk barn was running 24/7 in an effort to keep up with demand. Robert bought more cows and the family and their hired hands were milking the cows by hand twice a day. Robert eventually bought a second dairy on the west side of 19th street. Robert put most of his profit back into his farm, purchasing more land, clearing Eucalyptus trees with dynamite, digging wells, and building two new silos until he was able to support a herd of over 500 cows and use the spare land to grow vegetables.

The Egger Family's hard work brought them modest prosperity that they were then able to share with the community. In 1939, Robert Egger Sr. pulled together a group of local Swiss families and they founded the San Diego County Swiss Club. He donated 5 acres on 17th St. and Coronado Ave. for a community park. When Bishop Buddy wanted to found a Catholic Church in the area, Robert donated more land that eventually became St. Charles Church, St. Charles School, and Marian Catholic High School. To keep the community safe during the war, Robert even worked with the office of civil defense to install an air raid alarm atop his silo and he volunteered for nighttime patrols. To help local children, Robert provided two pieces of land to the Little League and he provided the Boy Scouts with a quonset hut on Sunset Ave. for meetings and campouts.

Inspired by Egger Dairy's success, other Swiss-run dairy farms started sprouting up in the area. The Hofer Family and the Zumstein family, both originally from the Imperial Valley, moved their dairy operations to the Tijuana River Valley to take advantage of the more forgiving weather. Robert's own dairy foreman, Johann Kastlunger, used the knowledge and earnings he gained from Egger Dairy to start his own dairy on Hollister St. in Palm City.

Many new Swiss immigrants came to live and work at Egger Dairy while they acclimated to their new country. Some only stayed a short while until they found other work, but others stayed on permanently. Robert's brother Leo moved to the US with his wife, Blondie, and Leo came to work at the farm. While working in the dairy's repair shop, Leo learned the skills of welding and metal fabrication, useful trades in America. Paul Odermatt, a talented Swiss carpenter, started working for Robert in 1955, when Robert contracted him to build a new farm house. He stayed on to help build corrals and eventually married Robert's only daughter, Mary. A young Swiss girl named Marianne moved into the farmhouse to help Emma Egger. Rather than moving on, she stayed and married into the family, choosing Robert's younger son, Walter.

Egger Dairy continued to expand and prosper well into the 40's and 50's. However by 1960, rising property taxes started to take a toll. Robert Egger was forced to sell large portions of land to keep up with increased tax assessments. Other issues started to appear. People began to drink less milk, favoring trendier beverages instead, which led to a milk surplus. The dairy could only sell 75% of its milk, so Robert and his workers were forced to dump the rest. Because the farm could not sell all their milk through the Dairy Mart collective, Robert along with his son Walter, and another local farmer, George Schurig, founded a new creamery named Swiss Farms in 1966. The creamery saw moderate success and many locals may remember being served Swiss Farms milk in school.

Rising operating costs caused many local farms to decline or cease operations in the 70's. Egger Dairy was struggling, but still in operation when Emma Egger passed away in 1974 and Robert Egger Sr. passed away in 1978. Their sons, Robert Jr. and Walter, continued as long as they could. The vegetable farm was shut down in 1985, but the dairy continued a little longer. However in 1987, with only 220 cows remaining, it too was shut down. Egger Dairy was the last remaining dairy in the South Bay.

Egger Dairy may have ceased operations, but its legacy still exists. The San Diego County Swiss Club is still going strong, as is St. Charles. Many of the old farm's green fields now support homes. The neighborhood of Egger Highlands and a community park still bear the Egger name. If you drive past the last piece of dairy land, you may even catch a glimpse of the old milk barn.




Paul Odermatt's 95th Birthday!






